

Life In The Year 2013 . .

Happy New Year! We hope everyone had a wonderful time during the holidays. Do you have a lot of plans for 2013? Well, before you get carried away with all of the things you want to do, let's go back and take a look at what life was like in 1913:

- The average life expectancy was 50 years for men and 55 for women. The leading causes of death were diarrhea, heart disease, influenza, pneumonia and tuberculosis.
- Ten percent of all babies died before their first birthday.
- The average wage was about \$1,400 per year or about 85 cents per hour.
- On February 3, 1913, the 16th Amendment was ratified and the IRS was formed. Couples earning more than \$4,000 per year and singles earning more than \$3,000 per year were taxed at the rate of 1%. Those earning \$500,000 or more were taxed at the top rate of 7%. Less than 1% of our population had to pay federal income tax. (Don't you wish rates were still that low?)
- A gallon of milk cost about 32 cents. A loaf of bread sold for 6 cents. Eggs were 30 cents a dozen. Houses sold for about \$3,400. Cars cost about \$500. Gasoline sold for a whopping 12 cents a gallon!
- The 17th Amendment was ratified on April 8, 1913 and established the direct election of US Senators by

popular vote. Prior to that, our Senators were elected by state legislators.

- New York's Grand Central Station, after being rebuilt, re-opened in February as the world's largest train station.
- On May 13th, Igor Sikorsky flew an airplane he had built and became the first person to pilot a four engine aircraft.
- A new record for the world's highest temperature of 134 degrees was set in Death Valley, on July 10th.
- Harry Brearley, of Sheffield England, invented stainless steel.
- On October 31st, the Lincoln Highway was dedicated as the first road for autos across the US. It went from New York City to San Francisco, through 13 states and was 3,389 miles long. Less than half of the route had improved roads. According to the Association's 1916 Official Road Guide, a trip from the Atlantic to the Pacific would take 20-30 days and would cost no more than \$5 dollars a day per person, including food, gas, oil, and even "five or six meals" in hotels!
- The first "sedan type" of a car (Hudson) goes on display at a New York City auto show. Before that, all cars were really "air conditioned". ☺
- Ford Motor Company introduced the first moving assembly line on December 1st. This reduced the time (turn the page)

The Miss America Pageant started off as a marketing idea. The goal of the Businessmen's League of Atlantic City was to keep tourist on the boardwalk past Labor Day. Their first event was a "Fall Frolic", held on September 25th, 1920. The event was so successful that they made it an annual event.

During that time, in an effort to increase circulation, newspapers on the East Coast had begun sponsoring beauty pageants judged on submitted photos. The Businessmen's League saw this and decided to capitalize on the idea. So, they invited the winners of these local newspaper beauty contests to the next "Fall Frolic" to compete in an "Inter-City Beauty Contest". The contest was based on two parts – a popularity contest and a beauty contest. The winner of the beauty contest was to be awarded the title of "Golden Mermaid". On September 8, 1921, they had one hundred thousand people come to the Boardwalk to watch. That year, 16 year old Margaret Gorman of Washington D.C. won both contests and was awarded \$100. When she returned in 1922 to defend her laurels, she was draped in an American flag and called "Miss America".

The first televised pageant was held in 1955, when Lee Meriwether won. In the 1960's, it was repeatedly the highest rated program on American television. The pageant was seen as a symbol of the United States, with Miss America often referred to as the equivalent of the President.

There have been 87 Pageants since 1921 and the states of California, Ohio and Oklahoma have each had 6 winners.

This year, the Miss America Pageant will be held on January 12th, in Las Vegas Nevada.

Food + Salmonella + Pests = Food Poisoning

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) recently released documents showing that a peanut butter company, Sunland, Inc., is at the heart of a Salmonella outbreak and recall of over 250 products. Located in Portales, New Mexico, this company has had unresolved food safety problems, including Salmonella and other pest control issues, for the last five years.

As of this writing, 41 people have been infected with Salmonella/Bredeney in 20 states and 10 of those have had to be hospitalized.

FDA documents cite the presence of Salmonella in the plant, pest problems, poor food safety practices by employees, poor maintenance of the building and equipment and improper storage of raw materials.

One of the most alarming facts is that peanuts are being stored outside in uncovered trailers. Inspectors noted birds, too numerous to count, flying over, landing on and pooping on nuts before they are processed. The nuts are also exposed to rain, which provides a growth environment for Salmonella and other bacteria.

This company has no records documenting the cleaning of production equipment. Super-sized bags used to store peanuts were not cleaned, despite being used for both raw and roasted peanuts. And, there are no hand-washing sinks in the production areas.

An outbreak of this type is very serious and you need to pay special attention to articles and updates published by the FDA and the Centers of Disease Control (CDC).
